Children in the US often ask why they have to do things the way they are taught. Grown-ups ask them questions all the time, so discussion is important. American teachers feel their children are learning when they talk and write about things they study.

In many American Indian cultures, learning is a quieter thing. At home, children often learn that it is bad manners to ask questions to grown-ups, or to look at **them** in the face, instead of looking down. Therefore, at schools, many Indians do not ask questions or give answers on their own.

There is an Indian story about an animal who asks an oil tree too many questions. The tree cannot see as well as the animal but he keeps asking about the things around him. Then he tries to cross a river. Every time he moves, he asks the tree how deep the river is. At last, he falls under the water. The animal asks no more questions, and the tree can rest again. With all his questions, the animal never learned what he needed to know.

The Indian parents also have a different style of teaching. Indian parents who want their children to be good weavers give them lots of time to weave so they can learn to do it well. If the girl can't do the weaving in a good way, her parents **punish** her because they think that weaving is a way of life for them. Parents send their daughters to some local schools to learn weaving. When they weave successfully, they are rewarded by the parents.

For all these differences, however, parents still want many of the same things for their children. They want them to know how to be part of their family and their culture. They want them to know how to work. Children, in school or out, have the same rights all over the world, to learn, grow up, and pass their culture on.

VI- READING COMPREHENSION (110 Marks)

"Koko" was a female gorilla. She was known for having learned a large number of hand signs from American Sign Language. Koko was able to understand more than 1,000 signs of what Patterson, her instructor and trainer, calls "Gorilla Sign Language". Koko was born at the San Francisco Zoo and lived most of her life in California. Koko gained public attention in the broadcast media because she adopted a kitten as a pet. Koko was also known for meeting many celebrities.

In contrast to other experiments attempting to teach sign language to non-humans, Patterson at the same time, exposed Koko to spoken English from an early age. Patterson reported that Koko understood approximately 2,000 words of spoken English, in addition to the signs. It is generally accepted that she did not use grammar, and that her use of language did not exceed that of a young human child.

A researcher said that Koko asked for a cat in 1983. Ron Cohn, a biologist, explained that when she was given a lifelike stuffed animal, she was less than satisfied. She did not play with it and continued to sign "sad". So on her birthday in July 1984, she was able to choose a kitten. Koko selected a gray male and named him "All Ball". Koko cared for the kitten as if it was a baby gorilla. They said that she tried to nurse "All Ball" and was very gentle and loving.

In December 1984, "All Ball" escaped from Koko's cage and was hit and killed by a car. Later, Patterson said that when she signed to Koko that "All Ball" had been killed, Koko signed "Bad, sad, bad, cry, frown, sad". Patterson also reported later hearing Koko making a sound similar to human weeping.

Koko died in her sleep during the morning of June 19, 2018, at the Gorilla Foundation's preserve in Woodside, California, at the age of 46. The Gorilla Foundation released a statement that "Her impact has been very deep and what she has taught us about the emotions of gorillas and their mental abilities will continue to shape the world."

Since then, our understanding of animal intelligence and emotional capabilities has grown. Koko was a huge part of this change in viewpoint. Since "Project Koko" began in 1972, she challenged our ideas on what animals are capable of.

Koko was able to understand more than 1,000 signs of what Patterson, her instructor and trainer, calls "Gorilla Sign Language". Koko was born at the San Francisco Zoo and lived most of her life in California. Koko gained public attention in the broadcast media because she adopted a kitten as a pet. 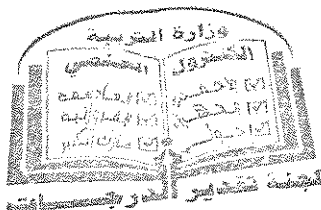
In contrast to other experiments attempting to teach sign language to non-humans, Patterson at the same time, exposed Koko to spoken English from an early age. Patterson reported that Koko understood approximately 2,000 words of spoken English, in addition to the signs. It is generally accepted that she did not use grammar, and that her use of language did not exceed that of a young human child.

A researcher said that Koko asked for a cat in 1983. Ron Cohn, a biologist, explained that when she was given a lifelike stuffed animal, she was less than satisfied. She did not play with it and continued to sign "sad". So on her birthday in July 1984, she was able to choose a kitten. Koko selected a gray male and named him "All Ball". Koko cared for the kitten as if it was a baby gorilla. They said that she tried to nurse "All Ball" and was very gentle and loving.

In December 1984, "All Ball" escaped from Koko's cage and was hit and killed by a car. Later, Patterson said that when she signed to Koko that "All Ball" had been killed, Koko signed "Bad, sad, bad, cry, frown, sad". Patterson also reported later hearing Koko making a sound similar to human weeping.

Koko died in her sleep during the morning of June 19, 2018, at the Gorilla Foundation's preserve in Woodside, California, at the age of 46. The Gorilla Foundation released a statement that "Her impact has been very deep and what she has taught us about the emotions of gorillas and their mental abilities will continue to shape the world."

Since then, our understanding of animal intelligence and emotional capabilities has grown. Koko was a huge part of this change in viewpoint. Since "Project Koko" began in 1972, she challenged our ideas on what animals are capable of.

Caffeine consistently leads to improvements in various aspects of brain function, including improved mood, vigilance, reaction time and memory. Because of the smaller dose of caffeine, green tea can give you a much milder and different kind of “excitement” than coffee. Many people report having more stable energy and being much more productive when they drink green tea, compared to coffee.

Green tea increases fat burning and improves physical performance. If you look at the ingredients list for any fat burning drink, green tea will have good chances to be there. In a study on ten healthy men, green tea increased energy spending by 4%, which led to an increase in the burning of fat. Caffeine, itself, has been shown to improve physical performance by preparing fatty acids to be used as energy.

Antioxidants in green tea may lower your risk of various types of cancer. Cancer is uncontrolled growth of cells. Green tea is an excellent source of powerful antioxidants, which can have a **preventive** effect and may stop the development of cancer. Multiple observational studies show that green tea drinkers are significantly less likely to get various types of cancer. It is important to keep in mind that it may be a bad idea to put milk in your tea, because **it** can reduce the antioxidant value.

The caffeine amount in green tea, which is not as much as in coffee, is enough to produce a response without causing the nervous effects associated with too much caffeine. Caffeine consistently leads to improvements in various aspects of brain function, including improved mood, vigilance, reaction time and memory. Because of the smaller dose of caffeine, green tea can give you a much milder and different kind of "excitement" than coffee. Many people report having more stable energy and being much more productive when they drink green tea compared to coffee.

Green tea increases fat burning and improves physical performance. If you look at the ingredients list for any fat burning drink, green tea will have good chances to be there. In a study on ten healthy men, green tea increased energy spending by 4%, which led to an increase in the burning of fat. Caffeine, itself, has been shown to improve physical performance by preparing fatty acids to be used as energy.

Antioxidants in green tea may lower your risk of various types of cancer. Cancer is uncontrolled growth of cells. Green tea is an excellent source of powerful antioxidants, which can have a **preventive** effect and may stop the development of cancer. Multiple observational studies show that green tea drinkers are significantly less likely to get various types of cancer. It is important to keep in mind that it may be a bad idea to put milk in your tea, because **it** can reduce the antioxidant value.

Green tea may have its risks. In some people, it can cause stomach upset. It has also been reported to cause liver problems in rare cases. Green tea is possibly unsafe when taken in high doses (more than 4 cups a day). It can cause side effects because of the caffeine. These side effects include headache, nervousness, sleep problems, irregular heart beat and dizziness. It also seems to decrease the amount of calcium in the body.

Producing a newspaper is a demanding work as it requires speed and good organisation. Reporters, editors and photographers always face **deadlines**. Newspapers have two formats: standard newspapers and tabloids. Standard newspapers are large pages. Generally, these newspapers are more serious and present more facts than tabloids. Tabloids are smaller pages. They concentrate on thrilling stories and often publish rumours about famous people combined with big pictures.

Newspapers can be divided into three basic types: dailies, weeklies and special interest newspapers. Daily newspapers print world, national and local news. Many of **them** also have a section about events that happen in the area. Sunday newspapers have additional features and more pages than weekday editions. Topics like entertainment, finance or travel are included in separate sections. Weekly papers are distributed in a smaller area and have news that is local and personal. Special interest newspapers are for a special part of the population, like Hispanics in America.

The first step in printing a newspaper is to collect enough information. Reporters do a lot of research to gather the facts. Most reporters only provide information and the basic facts of a story. Writing and Editing is the second step. This is usually done by news editors. They write stories on computers that are connected together. The finished story goes to a copy editor, who is responsible for correcting spelling and making the story easier to read. The third step is creating a layout. The layout shows where the text, photos, advertisements etc. should appear on the page. The last step is printing the newspaper when the completed paper is transferred electronically from computers to the printing press.

The invention of computers in the 20th century has changed the way newspapers are made. Today, reporters can save time by sending the main facts of their stories by e-mail. Editors can easily make corrections with spell checkers. Increasing costs of publishing, however, have also driven many newspapers out of business. A newspaper cannot exist without advertisements. They pay for at least 75 % of all costs. Newspapers carry two types of ads. Display ads can be as large as a full page and can include illustrations and photos. Newspapers belong to the oldest methods of getting information to the public and keeping people well-informed on important events. They can cover more news in detail than other media. Producing a newspaper is a demanding work as it requires speed and good organisation. Reporters, editors and photographers always face **deadlines**. Newspapers have two formats: standard newspapers and tabloids. Standard newspapers are large pages. Generally, these newspapers are more serious and present more facts than tabloids. Tabloids are smaller pages. They concentrate on thrilling stories and often publish rumours about famous people combined with big pictures.

Newspapers can be divided into three basic types: dailies, weeklies and special interest newspapers. Daily newspapers print world, national and local news. Many of **them** also have a section about events that happen in the area. Sunday newspapers have additional features and more pages than weekday editions. Topics like entertainment, finance or travel are included in separate sections. Weekly papers are distributed in a smaller area and have news that is local and personal. Special interest newspapers are for a special part of the population, like Hispanics in America.

The first step in printing a newspaper is to collect enough information. Reporters do a lot of research to gather the facts. Most reporters only provide information and the basic facts of a story. Writing and Editing is the second step. This is usually done by news editors. They write stories on computers that are connected together. The finished story goes to a copy editor, who is responsible for correcting spelling and making the story easier to read. The third step is creating a layout. The layout shows where the text, photos, advertisements etc. should appear on the page. The last step is printing the newspaper when the completed paper is transferred electronically from computers to the printing press.

The invention of computers in the 20th century has changed the way newspapers are made. Today, reporters can save time by sending the main facts of their stories by e-mail. Editors can easily make corrections with spell checkers. Increasing costs of publishing, however, have also driven many newspapers out of business. A newspaper cannot exist without advertisements. They pay for at least 75 % of all costs. Newspapers carry two types of ads. Display ads can be as large as a full page and can include illustrations and photos. Classified ads have only a few lines in which people offer goods and services or look for jobs and apartments.
