Many people live their lives based on emotions. There are both negative and positive emotions that govern our minds. Positive emotions are those that bring happiness to us as well as to all those around us as love and kindness. Negative emotions are those that make us restless and unhappy and also force us to spread the same to everyone around like hate and anger. Anger however, is perhaps the most destructive of all emotions. It is an emotion which is secondary to some other emotions that you are feeling like fear, guilt or relief. So the parent who shouts at her kid, who gets home late, is using anger as a way of **displacing** fear.

Anger has many causes. Anger is a natural response to threats caused by both external and internal events. Examples of external triggers are a traffic jam, the neighbor's loud stereo or when someone is wrongly accused of a crime. Internal examples include worrying or about personal problems .But anger may have other causes as well. Changes in hormone levels seem to cause anger too, and inheritance plays a part, as does our upbringing. The more we are raised in anger, the more anger we are likely to feel later in our lives.

Most researchers think that anger leads to an increased risk of heart attack, but studies show that keeping anger inside oneself is bad for you too. Women who constantly control their anger, for example, show a higher death rate than those that don't. When people suppress **their** anger, one study suggests, this is more damaging to the woman's health than the man's. So it seems that while frequent anger is bad for you, the suppression of anger is worse. Some scientists suggest that using anger consciously is a good thing, provided it is not too extreme or out of control, but others are convinced that anger could be one of the main factors controlling our emotional and physical health.

There are many ways to help you overcome anger. When you feel anger arising in you, start breathing deeply and slowly several times. Drinking some water has a calming effect on the body too. Try to be more patient and more tolerant towards people even those you don't like. You shouldn't take everything seriously .It is not worth it. Positive thinking makes it easier to disregard remarks and behavior that otherwise could cause anger.





One hundred years ago, the invention of automobile was viewed as a great step forward. Today car engines are not always considered such wonderful machines. In fact, they are the cause of a number of social and environmental problems worldwide. The most serious of these is air pollution. In fact, burning gasoline and diesel fuel in motor vehicles releases many chemicals into the atmosphere, including large amounts of CO₂. Higher levels CO₂ in the atmosphere have led to warmer weather and climate change around the world.

One way to limit the amount of CO₂ produced by cars and trucks is to encourage people to use motor vehicles less, this will mean making major changes in transportation systems. In most parts of the United States, for examples, the only way to get around is by car. It is often dangerous or impossible to travel on foot or by bicycle, and there may be few or no buses or trains. In some US cities, public transportation does exist, but few people use **it** because it is often unattractive, inconvenient, and expensive.

Pollution from motor vehicles can be further reduced by changing the engines of motor vehicles so they use different fuels. There are several nonpolluting fuels already available. One is natural gas. Several large cities in the United States are setting an example by replacing older buses and vans with vehicles that burn natural gas. Electricity is another important source of energy that pollutes less. Electric vehicles are becoming more **efficient** as the technology improves.

Of all the new fuels, hydrogen is the clean fuel that scientists believe could be the fuel of the future. Hydrogen fuel cells create energy by combining hydrogen with oxygen. They do not release any pollution into the atmosphere – only water. A small amount of energy is required to produce the hydrogen, but this energy could be supplied by pollution – free solar or wind power. Though the first fuel cells, invented in the 1980s, were very large and quite expensive, the newest fuel cells are much smaller and less expensive. Hydrogen – powered vehicles could soon be sold at reasonable prices if governments and automobile manufactures invest in the development of this nonpolluting technology.

What do you do when you are hungry? If you're like many people, you probably like something sweet for a snack. A tree is like a hungry child because it needs food to grow, and it prefers sugar. It's not exactly the same sugar we find in candy and cookies, but it is a special kind called glucose **that** makes trees grow.

You might be thinking, 'How does a tree eat the food (sugar)? Trees don't have mouths. They have roots to take in water and minerals, but they don't get food through their roots either. Trees make their sugar in their leaves. The sugar is sent from the leaves into the branches, trunk, and roots. When a tree "eats," it moves sugar from the leaves to all its other parts. When your mom makes cookies, she uses a recipe with certain ingredients. When a tree grows, it uses its own recipe.

Trees grow mostly in spring and summer, where there is a lot of sunshine every day. When fall begins, the days get shorter and there is less sun. This warns the tree to begin getting ready for winter. The leaves begin to turn red, orange, gold, and brown, because with less sunlight and water, the green chlorophyll in the cells of the plant begins to disappear. As winter begins to approach, the tree uses the food it stored during spring and summer, and goes into a rest period.

We plant trees primarily for their beauty and to provide shade, but they do create many other benefits. Trees can sooth and relax us and help us connect to nature and our surroundings. The colour green is a calming, cool colour that helps our eyes quickly recover from strain. By planting and caring for trees, we help **improve** our surrounding and reduce pollution. Trees absorb harmful gasses from the air and release oxygen.

People cut down trees to make furniture, equipment and paper, but overcutting of trees makes our environment dirty and deserted. Without trees, we could potentially suffer because of lack of oxygen and there would be no life.



Malnutrition is a dietary condition caused by a **deficiency** or excess of one or more essential nutrients in the diet. Malnutrition is characterized by a wide range of health problems. They include extreme weight loss, weakened resistance to infection, and weakening of brainpower. Severe cases of malnutrition can lead to death .

For one thing, deficiency diseases result from inadequate intake of the major nutrients. These deficiencies can result from eating foods that lack critical vitamins and minerals, from a lack of variety of foods, or from simply not having enough food. When the body is not given enough of any one of the essential nutrients over a period of time, it becomes weak and less able to fight infection. The brain may become inactive and react slowly. The body taps **its** stored fat for energy, and muscle is broken down to use for energy. Eventually the body fades away, the heart ceases to pump properly, and death occurs.

Although malnutrition is more **commonly** associated with dietary deficiencies, it also can develop in cases where people have enough food to eat, but they choose foods low in essential nutrients. This is the more common form of malnutrition in most developed countries. When poor food choices are made, a person may be getting an adequate amount of calories each day, yet still be starving. For example, low intake of calcium is directly related to poor quality bones and increased breakage risk, especially in the elderly.

A fatty diet may also lead to other nutritional problems. Obesity is one of these problems. It is the condition of having too much body fat. It has been linked to life-threatening diseases including diabetes, heart problems, and some forms of cancer. Eating too many salty foods may contribute to high blood pressure.

High blood pressure can lead to strokes, heart attacks, and kidney failure. A diet high in cholesterol and fat, particularly saturated fat, is the primary cause of arthritis, which results when fat and cholesterol deposits build up in the arteries, causing a reduction in blood flow.

No money, pottery, art, language, or people from Atlantis have ever been found. In his writing, Plato described a **staggering** kingdom: "an island greater in extent than Asia." If there were such a place, there should be some trace of it left.

In April 2004, American Robert Sarmast **contended** that he had gathered proof that Atlantis sank between Cyprus and Syria. Sarmast used digital imaging technology that was not available to previous explorers. "What we have discovered is a hidden landmass that fits Plato's famed description almost exactly," he said.

He said he located 48 of 50 geographical features mentioned by Plato. One feature is the landmass. It is the same size as the one Plato described. Another feature is a large rectangular plain that could be the location of the capital city. Plato also guessed that the highest mountains of Atlantis might still be above water. If Sarmast is correct, the island of Cyprus might actually be the top mountains of Atlantis!

Angela Henderson, a member of Sarmast's team, said that finding Atlantis would be "the single most important archaeological discovery in history." Some scientists, though, do not respect the work of researchers like Sarmast. **They** think he is just trying to make money. After all, Sarmast is not a scientist. He studied architecture in university.

Some scientists believe that Atlantis was just a real city, but not really an island. They think that the people who translated Plato's writings made a mistake. The ancient Greek word for "island" is very similar to the word for "coastline." They think that Atlantis was a city on the coast of Cyprus and that a great flood destroyed the city. They don't believe that an enormous island actually disappeared under the ocean.

Will Atlantis ever be found? If Sarmast does not discover the lost city, other explorers will surely continue looking for it. It might actually be good if we never find Atlantis. That way, future generations can continue to enjoy the mystery and wonder about the lost city.
